Q. Another impressive performance out here at the Dana Open. What was working so well on day two for you?

So you have to be a little more aggressive than you would do, for example, last week at Pebble. So different mindset, but I'm sure the weekend will be the same.

Q. Different mindset indeed. Because Pebble Beach a complete opposite kind of course going into this week. What was last week like for you at the U.S. Women's Open at Pebble?

GEMMA DRYBURGH: It was a dream. It passed all my expectations. It was nice to have family and friends there



as well to watch. But just -- it's my new favorite course. The views, just the course in general. Even if it wasn't by the sea it would be an amazing course, but it's obviously got amazing views as well. And to play a U.S. Open there is even more special. So it was, yeah, just gives me goose bumps thinking back to it.
