Q. You have like Mexico in a good place in your heart because there's the championship in doubles in Monterrey, now here the final. What's next for you for Mexico, because I know you are also going to Tampico, right?

CAROLINE DOLEHIDE: Yeah, that's the plan. I love Mexico. Any time I can come back, I'd come back. To be honest, I'm debating whether to come back and watch Storm play in Cancun. This is an amazing place to play



tennis. Everyone is so excited to watch tennis and to be involved in tennis. It's an amazing country and I love coming back.
