JORGE CAMPILLO: Yeah, I mean, not position that I wanted to be, but as I say before, it was a tough day and I managed to have a decent score. So hopefully tomorrow I can hit the same off the tee, hit the irons like the first two days and putts like today. So that'd be nice. And then I probably have a chance to win.

Q. Very historic tournament with a very rich history with a lot of incredible names behind it. What would it mean to add your name to that?

JORGE CAMPILLO: That'd be great. This is one of the best tournaments of the year, and many people come and watch this. It's really exciting. I always feel like that I have some good finishes on the Irish Open. It would be nice to win, obviously.

Q. It is quite an incredible crowd. I know obviously people like Shane, Seamus, and Pádraig all have an incredible following, but you must feel like you're at a fifth major in a way?

JORGE CAMPILLO: Yeah, definitely. Definitely. As I said, it's one of the best regular tournaments of the year. I remember when I finished third, I think it was 2018, a lot of people came and watched, and I feel like they were





supporting me too. And it was a nice feeling.
