MEGHA GANNE: It's near impossible. I'm not gonna lie. I was thinking about this trophy the entire day, which makes it really distracting to play golf. I was trying my absolute hardest to think about the shot in front of me.

And Brooke did not make it easy on me. She's an incredible competitor. She showed so much fight. Congratulations to her and her family on an incredible week.

Q. On the 15th hole you had just inside of 20 feet; two putts to win. How would you describe the nerves of actually trying to accomplish that feat?

MEGHA GANNE: I want to say I felt like I was definitely going to two-putt it, and then I left myself a little more work than I thought. I just wanted to make it dramatic, you know. (Smiling.)

Q. You have your parents here, your coach, Katie. What have they done for you to get you to this spot?

MEGHA GANNE: I -- they're like the definition of



unconditional love. My parents, my sister, coach, Katie, and all my family from home, from Stanford, my Stanford coaches.

It genuinely takes a village to make something like this happen, and there is not a day that goes by where I don't feel so much love from people in my life regardless if I am on the golf course or off or winning or losing.

MEGHA GANNE: Really good things. This is likely my last Women's Amateur, so I really, really wanted to get this done. I can't wait for a great senior year with our squad. Hopefully we have another chance at a national title that slipped away from us this year.
