Q. This is the first year that championship is broadcast live on Golf Channel. What does that mean to you?

SIMON LEE: (Through translation.) It's a great thing to have live on the Golf Channel, but to me, so used to the TV and spotlight in Korea, so it wasn't kind of -- but to have people watch him play through Golf Channel, that means a lot.

Q. Last question: What's next on the schedule for this summer?

SIMON LEE: (Through translation.) I'll be playing mixed with China tour and Korea tour. My goal is to keep the card so I can play again next year in China and Korea, regular KPGA and regular China professional golf association, which means a lot to me to keep that up.
