The ball is going through the rain, the ball doesn't go as far.

Q. Did you hit it close?

BRANDON ROBINSON THOMPSON: No -- well, close, I was very happy with it. I was like 30 feet. Good enough.

A lot different than yesterday. It was driver, sand wedge. And
