

It was a team effort today so got to enjoy it. Again, things to work on but you know, I think we did a great job of not allowing a goal. Bobby did a great job tonight organizing us, coming up big in the moments he needed to, and it was a great team effort.

What is that like as a player experiencing it and how do you approach it knowing the magnitude of each game? Take me into a player's mindset this time of year.
