Q. First of all, this is your first time back. You were traded from Montréal to Chicago a couple weeks ago. What are your emotions coming back for the first time to play?

I think we could move the ball a little bit quicker and try to get some more penetrating passes and a little bit more movement. It's tough when you don't see the ball hit the back of the net. I think with goals and wins, it gives us confidence but right now, we're just trying to find that rhythm.

Q. I guess for yourself individually, you have three games left on your contract and the team has a long shot, zero at this point, making the playoffs. How go about the next three games not knowing what's next?
