NA YEON CHOI: I would first like to thank my friends for coming all the way from Seoul. My friends really supported me during tough times. To support each other and wish the best for each other whilst playing in the same tour, as professional golfers is actually harder than it looks, but Inbi, Soyeon, Jeongeun have helped greatly with golf and mentally as well. So I am really grateful for the five players who are here today.

Also, today I was joined by fans from abroad and from far away, and I really cannot leave out my fans when I think about my career. They created a fan club early on and supported me making banners and matching clothes. At first it was a bit awkward for me, but now they are my family. I am very grateful for them. I was able to work harder and become the player I am today thanks to them.
