Q. Here with Isabella Fierro at the Riviera Maya Open at Mayakoba. Awesome round today to fight to make the cut. What can you talk about today?

I'm just I'm, just really excited and I'm really proud of what I've become and my team have become and I've just really happy that I get to play the weekend.
