THE MODERATOR: Questions for R.J.

- Q. SMU has had one of the most dynamic offenses in college football. Can you touch on you and the tight end and the wide receiver room.
- R.J. MARYLAND: Yes, just all of us as a collective, the past two years we've been able to put up a lot of big numbers. Coach Lashlee just put us in a good game plan. We just go out and execute.

- R.J. MARYLAND: It's always been a good offense. Not much has changed. Our mindset maybe, but no play calls 'cause coach has got us on that.

Yeah, we have gotten a lot of new players. They bought into what Coach Lashlee has taught us. It's all good.
