Q. I know probably not the round you were hoping for today, but what can you take away from this experience this week moving forward?

MEJA ÖRTENGREN: I was just so happy to play the course again and walk these fairways with so many people watching. I think I'm very grateful to be here and to play, even though it didn't go my way.

I think all the girls are great at golf, and I think many of the pin positions that were today is -- if you hit the right spot on the green, it kind of feeds towards the hole so you can have kind of a short putt for birdie. I think that is what the girls are doing great.
