#### Q. Could you describe what it was like to play with Bernhard today on such a historic day?

Q. You've had a pretty historic run here. I think you came into Hazeltine ranked 550-ish in the world, get to runner-up at the U.S. Am, gets you to the Masters. How does that change your outlook for the next couple years at Florida?

NOAH KENT: Yeah, PGA TOUR U stuff, it's just the same grind. You want to be out here one day. I'll tell you what, it'll make every college event seem a little bit easier after playing here. You'll definitely be able to -- I was talking to my caddie on 18, it's like, you can't out-smart anybody out here, but I feel like in college you can outsmart people sometimes.
