Q. Obviously, the great performance yesterday and day before was a solid performance. How do you feel going into the tournament with all the guys here except for Joc?

Hopefully the WBC we can create even more excitement there and get more kids to the field because, you know, the fields are starting to get built. Obviously, I think it's a great game, so it would be nice to see the youth there really grab ahold of the sport.

Your second question about Miggy, I played with Miggy in Detroit for four years. I don't know how upset he is about the Tigers finally moving in the fences for his last year.



You know, I don't know what that's all about, but he has had an incredible Hall of Fame career. In my opinion just a shoe-in, first-ballot type of career.
