Q. Having the front row seat to Scottie today, does it compare to any one or certain round that you played in in the past, just in terms of the impressiveness and maybe the dominance?

SHANE LOWRY: Look, I think he obviously played very well, but when he hit the bad shots he got them up and down, that was key. He holed the right putts at the right time. A couple of things change and you just never know. Like, down this stretch here, you put somebody, no matter who they are, no matter how good they are under pressure, you never know what could happen. I don't think he got that. Now, I'm not saying that he wouldn't have won, but I just didn't get a chance to -- I kept missing fairways and then leaving 30 feet for birdie and you run it by and you have four, five feet back, and these greens are difficult. So it's tough for me to talk about and think about it right now, because I'm just in off the course and I was so focused on my own game and trying to have the best week I could, but I'll sit down and reflect on it over the next
