And then yeah, I played nicely on the back nine and I managed to roll in some birdies, which was great, and we kept it together towards the end and finished with a nice score.

Q. Alex, I know you mentioned the front nine for you, a little bit shakier. Do you feel like you got your footing there on the second nine just to kind of come home with some birdies?

ALEX FITZPATRICK: Yeah, a little bit. I kind of haven't been swinging it the best this week so far, so for me, it was just especially on the back nine was how am I going to figure out how to get it in the fairway at least. Hit a few more, which was nice, and that led to a few more opportunities for birdie, and managed to capitalize, which was nice. But yeah, had a lot of fun out there, so I'm looking forward to tomorrow.

Q. Alex, where does this rank in terms of professional events and moments that you've had so far?

ALEX FITZPATRICK: For about -- I guess I've been professional about a year, and it couldn't be further away from anything else. I had so much fun out there. It was



extra special spending time with him and being on the course, but playing together and working together is a lot of fun, and yeah, it helps a little bit when you have a good score. Yeah, it was great.

Q. Similar for you, Matt, where does this stack up?

Q. Is there a certain phrase you'll use for tomorrow? You used dovetail today. What about tomorrow?

MATT FITZPATRICK: Just play well. Just play well.
