Q. Electric stuff down the wire right there. Walk me through those last few holes, how you responded to that late run from Niall.

JACKSON HERRINGTON: It was tough. I knew walking down 14, I had a chance to get to 3 up, but missed that putt, but I knew he wasn't going anywhere. I didn't make a bad shot on 16, but it went straight into the wind, got a little bit of water on the ball. Then won that hole, won 17. I didn't feel like I hit all that bad of a shot on 17. Just drew a little more on me, I thought, with the wind.

- 18, I played this hole pretty well this week. I knew I could do it. Wind was in my favor. I hit a cut, was going to straighten every ball out. Had a good number for second shot.

JACKSON HERRINGTON: It was funny. Everyone was yelling Niall, and some guy said Jackson, and I had to give him a little pump. It was awesome.
